Critical to the success of any plan however is determining who needs to provide input into the plan; determining how realistic the goals, strategies, required resources, and timeframe are and finally; how effectively the organization tracks accountability and progress. In this session, we'll engage in several activities where you'll learn about the components of a strategic plan and the process for engaging key stakeholders.
